About the Seminar

Histories and cultures in the construction had started to draw the attention of researchers in architectural history. The discipline had long been relying heavily on drawings and manuscripts produced by architectural professionals, thus over-emphasising the role of architects and engineers in the production of buildings. Drawing upon examples since the mid-19th Century, this talk will examine how the cultures and practices in construction had influenced the decision-making process of engineers and architects. It will demonstrate that architectural professionals were often far less autonomous in determining the design of buildings.
